- Statute requires the State graduation proficiency assessment to be administered to all grade 11 students. (N.J.S.A. 18A:7C-6)
- NJGPA is designed to measure the extent to which students are graduation ready in English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics.
- Graduation readiness is reported separately for each content component.
- The ELA component is aligned to the grade 10 standards.
- The Mathematics component is aligned to Algebra I and Geometry standards.





- On May 3, 2023, the New Jersey State Board of Education adopted the proficiency level cut score for the English language Arts (ELA) and mathematics components of the NJGPA, as well as the menu of alternative assessments and aligned cut scores.
- Students who take but do not meet the minimum required score on each component of the assessment will have the opportunity to receive additional supports and may take the following steps:
 - Retake the ELA and/or mathematics components of the New Jersey Graduation Proficiency Assessment in the following summer or fall;
 - Meet a designated cut score from the menu of substitute competency tests; or
 - Complete a portfolio appeal.

Intervention Strategies – ELA



- ELA supervisor will work with the grade 11 teachers to
 - Analyze data from 2024 NJGPA
 - Review LinkIt Form C data from English II courses
 - Review NJGPA blueprints, question types, and the rigor of the exam
- Align 2024-2025 PD to focus their study on NJGPA blueprints and then explore, implement, and reflect on best practices to prepare grade 11 students to take the NJGPA in March 2025
- Continue to implement individualized and computer adaptive programs
 No Red Ink and Membean to support students' language and vocabulary
 progress





- Grade 6-12 Math supervisor will work with the HS math teachers to:
 - Introduce and use ALEKS for students in Alg. I, Alg. II, Geometry, and Math Investigations allows for higher levels of remediation and acceleration for students
 - Investigate and use NJGPA data to ensure classwork models the same level of rigor
 - Ensure pacing of the curriculum aligns with the March NJGPA administration
- Professional development will focus on:
 - Teaching students how to problem solve using mathematical thinking
