• Mrs. Howe reported on the Good News and Progress in our schools.

G. <u>PRESENTATIONS</u>

- Dr. Roger Jinks, Jr., Assistant Superintendent of Schools presented the Spring 2024 NJSLA Science Results.
- Mrs. Jeanne Howe, Superintendent of Schools and Mrs. Rita Oroho Giacchi, Business Administrator presented the continuing Budget Series: Jefferson Township Public Schools Budget Process and History.

H. <u>COMMENTS FROM THE AUDIENCE</u> (on agenda action items only, if applicable)

- An audience member inquired if a tax increase was the only available option to assist in making up the difference in the school budget resulting from the reduction in state aid. They also inquired about where to go to file complaints.
- An audience member thanked Mrs. Howe for her efforts in trying to make the school funding issues widely known, and questioned if there were other ways to advertise the fight against S2. On the subject of test scores, it was asked if tracking can take place to follow one class to monitor any trends and determine what makes certain classes more successful with testing results.
- An audience member inquired about how the upcoming negotiations may affect the budget and noted that redistricting may cost money.

I. <u>STUDENT REPRESENTATIVES</u>

- Student Representative Ashley Hecht reported fall sports have concluded, homecoming events were well attended, girls' volleyball victory in States, NHS Blood drive and service night, PSAT's, youth coalition pinwheel display, college funding night, and the MetLife trip.
- Student Representative Victor Koziol reported on upcoming events such as the fall drama, National Honor Society Induction, Thanksgiving recess, the holiday concert, and the World Language Honor Society Induction ceremony.

J. <u>COMMITTEE REPORTS</u>

- Education Committee Mrs. Small reported the Committee met on November 11, 2024 and discussed differentiation of instruction, Chronic Absentee Action Plan, and day and overnight field trips. Mrs. Small noted there were several topics on the agenda that had been tabled until the Committee meets again in December.
 - The Committee was requested to revisit the topic of leveling in the middle school as well as homework practices.
 - Mrs. Howe reviewed how attendance is monitored and documented; daily in PK-8, daily and period attendance in 9-12 (tracked for loss of credit).
- New Jersey School Boards Association Mr. Stewart reported he will be attending the Delegate Assembly meeting on December 7, 2024.
- Morris County School Boards Association Mr. Natale reported the meeting will take place on December 14, 2024.
- Morris County Education Services Commission Mrs. Perez noted the Commission will hold its reorganization meeting in June, and recently attended a meeting.
- **Negotiations Committee** Mr. Natale reported the Committee met and began the negotiations process. The Committee will meet again on November 19, 2024.
- **Building Needs and Finance Committee** Mrs. Gould reported the Committee met on November 12, 2024 and discussed the 2025-2026 budget, reconfiguration updates including the anticipated results of the central office building appraisal and the confirmation that there will be three tiers for transportation in 2025-2026, updates on the 2024-2025 budget, and the 2023-2024 audit.
- Policy and Personnel Committee Mrs. Grater reported the Committee met on November 11, 2024 and discussed open positions in district, a revised job description, Policy 2431, and the need for administrative substitutes. Significant discussion and deliberation took place regarding Policy 2431 which included discussion items such as how to monitor student grades, discipline, attendance, and overall student accountability.



These employer contributions shall not exceed the limits of Section 415(c)(1) of the Section 403(b)(3) Code.
