H. STUDENT REPRESENTATIVES

- Student Representative Ashley Hecht reported on the NHS volleyball game and Buffalo Wild Wings fundraiser, Kindness Challenge, winter sports, and midterms. Miss Hecht also reported the high school hosted an AP Elective Fair and a leadership conference for local students participating in student council, a drug prevention conference and meeting with Representative Mikie Sherrill.
- Student Representative Victor Koziol reported on the upcoming dine to donate at Buffalo Wild wings, the Glammies (senior award show), DECA and FBLA competitions, and the spring musical "The Little Mermaid".

I. COMMITTEE REPORTS

- **Building Needs and Finance Committee** Mrs. Wildermuth reported the Committee met on February 3, 2025 and was provided an update on recent heating and plumbing issues. The Committee also discussed a proposal for the 2024-25 audit, vehicle sale/auction results, the 2025-2026 budget, and reconfiguration updates such as aftercare options for 4th and 5th grade students.
- **Policy and Personnel Committee** Mr. Natale reported the Committee met on February 3, 2025 and discussed open positions, leaves of absences, and policy and regulations. Mr. Natale noted one policy, #7510, had been tabled to the March agenda.
- Education Committee Mrs. Small reported the Committee met on February 3, 2025 and reviewed the middle school master schedule, 2024-2025 calendar revisions, and day and overnight field trips. She noted other items on the agenda have been moved to the March meeting.
- **Negotiations Committee** Mr. Brown reported the Committee met and progress was made. There are currently two future meetings scheduled.

- Community Relations Committee Mrs. Wildermuth reported on the goals of the Committee and noted they are looking to seek feedback from the community on topics that should be addressed, such as the rollout of the budget, chain of command, and HIB vs. Conflict. Mrs. Wildermuth also highlighted the role of a Board Member in HIB and advised of the intent to keep the reconfiguration page of the website as up to date as possible.
 - Mrs. Perez inquired about showcasing good news in the district, such as student-author Miss Madueno's children's book.
- New Jersey School Board Association Mr. Stewart attended the county meeting and reported the district's representative, Charlene Petersen, is retiring. He also noted there are two training sessions available for Board/Superintendent relationship. Mr. Natale noted the association is working on creating effective board culture. He also reported the number of signatures for board member candidate nominating petitions have increased from 10 to 25.
- Morris County Education Services Commission Mrs. Perez reported the commission did a presentation on nonpublic services, reviewed the audit, discussed sustainability of continuing to offer services, and the purchase of the Morris Regional Day School.
