AP ART & DESIGN SUMMER ASSIGNMENT

Welcome to AP Art & Design! This summer assignment will prepare you for a strong start to the school year and set the foundation for your AP portfolio. Complete all steps carefully and thoughtfully.

STEP 1: JOIN THE GOOGLE CLASSROOM

- Use the code **3k27ddct** to join the **JTHS 2025-26 AP Art & Design Google Classroom**.
- Review the document titled **"#1 Summer Assignment"** available in the Google Classroom.

STEP 2: CREATE THREE ORIGINAL ARTWORKS

To begin building your portfolio, create **three original artworks** during the summer.

Requirements:

- **Originality**: These artworks must be entirely original and cannot reuse past school assignments.
- **Materials and Styles**: Use mediums and styles that you enjoy, and feel free to explore techniques you are curious about.
- **Size**: Each artwork must be no larger than 18" x 24".
- **Supplies**: Purchase supplies at Michaels or Jerry's Artist Outlet, or shop online.

Guidelines for Submission:

For each artwork, prepare the following details to share on the first day of school:

- **Title** (italicized)
- **Medium** (e.g., acrylic, pencil, mixed media)
- **Size** (dimensions of the piece)
- Include reference images or sketches used during the process (if applicable).

Important Notes:

- Avoid copying published photographs. Use your own reference images, such as photos of friends, family, objects, landscapes, or places you visit.
- Keep a sketchbook to document your process and ideas.

STEP 3: VISIT MUSEUMS (VIRTUALLY OR IN PERSON)

Explore and connect with the art world by visiting museums. If in-person visits are not possible, use online museum resources.

Task: Select five artworks that inspire you and document the following information:

- Artwork image
- Artist's name
- Title (italicized)
- Year created
- Medium (materials used)
- Size
- Museum or gallery location

Task: Choose one portfolio that resonates with your style or media interests. Be prepared to discuss:

- What you learned about this portfolio type.
- How it relates to your artistic goals.

STEP 5: CREATE 10 SKETCHBOOK PAGES

Develop ten sketchbook pages exploring ideas and experimenting with materials.

Requirements:

- Fill each page completely, using mixed media where possible.
- Focus on creativity, exploration, and concept development.
- Refer to examples provided in the Google Classroom for inspiration.

Your sketchbook will be checked on the first day of school.

STEP 6: PREPARE FOR CLASS PRESENTATIONS

During the first week of school, you will present:

- 1. Your **three completed artworks**, including reference images or sketches.
- 2. Your **museum visit findings**, including the five inspiring artworks and the required details.
- 3. Your **chosen AP portfolio example**, explaining why it aligns with your goals.

All documentation for this assignment must be compiled in **a Google Slides presentation**. Use clear formatting, include images, and organize your slides by steps (e.g., Artworks, Museum Visits, Portfolio Example).
